## **MONTEVALLO ESTATE SALE TO BE HELD**

December 3rd, 1855

at the farm of Robert and Nancy Galloway, both deceased, of Montevallo, Shelby County, Alabama.

This month we present a typical example of a Montevallo estate sale in antebellum Alabama.

The Galloway estate sale was set in motion in two parts. Robert Galloway had died years before, but his Last Will had given his wife the right to live in the house and keep the farm in operation until her death, which occurred before December of 1855. There had been an inventory and some division of Robert's estate, but the bulk of the estate was held together for the remaining lifetime of his wife.

The eight heirs of the Galloway estate were:

- 1. Avaline Galloway Mink, wife of James Mink
- 2. Granderson Galloway
- 3. D. F. Galloway
- 4. A. M. Galloway
- 5. Matilda Galloway West, wife of Hugh R. West
- 6. Laura Galloway
- 7. Miles Galloway (deceased) his part to his daughter Millie
- 8. W. W. Galloway (deceased) his part to his daughter Sophronia

Here are some of the items for sale at the Montevallo Galloway family estate sale, and the prices paid for them.

The sale was held on the 3rd of December 1855, and is recorded in Will Book L, pages 264-266, at the Shelby County Archives.

Some property had already been divided among the heirs. The farm land was also sold. The best farm land in Shelby County could bring as much as \$10/ acre or more in the 1850's. Guardians were appointed by the court for the minor children, and the estate was finally settled after a few more years with equal division among all heirs, equally to the last half-penny! There were several unrelated Galloway families in Shelby County at the time. This particular family lived here over 175 years ago, and there is no implied or intended link to anyone who may be living here today.

# SAFETY-SPOT

### **Christmas Tree & Winter Holiday Safety**

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched!.

Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.

Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.

Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

Use a string of lights that have the label of a recognized testing laboratory.

Always turn off Christmas tree lights and blow out candles before leaving home or going to bed.

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the house or garage, or placed outside against the house.

Choose holiday decorations that are flame retardant.

Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.

Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.




# Untold Stories OF BLACK MONTEVALLO

# IN PRAISE OF THE POCKET WATCH: ALDRICH'S TIME-PIECE (PART 2)

Last month we began the story of a Black-edited paper published every Friday beginning in 1895 in the nearby coal-mining community of Aldrich. *Alabama Time-Piece* was one of nearly 100 African American newspapers circulating at the turn of the century but the only one originating in our area. It brings into view a vibrant community in Aldrich's Old Camp, a Black settlement within a racially mixed village not two miles from downtown Montevallo.

The Time-Piece's masthead is dominated by the image of a pocket watch with the motto "One Size" designed specifically for the paper. It reflects a key message its editor, B. L. "Booker" Lester, wanted to communicate. This is our time, he insists, we must take advantage of the times. "If you want keep Time with the Times, the Time-Piece is the TIMELY and TIMIEST TIMES " ("Dear Reader"). How best to keep time with the times? Learn to "live more economically, homes, save time, means and money, and educate children" Notes," 14 Oct 1898).



The pocket watch in the newspaper's title and on its masthead may symbolize the role the newspaper played in promoting self-sufficiency and prosperity among its readers, many of them members of the first-freed generation. Pocket watches were luxury items, beautifully crafted and expensive. They were markers of wealth and status. . . and during the period of enslavement they were beyond the reach of most people of color.

How wonderful then to find a pocket watch as the logo of an African American paper! A paper bought and read by formerly enslaved persons and their children. How fitting that a paper promoting Black prosperity as a tool of racial advancement would adopt the time-piece for its title. The motto "one size" just might point toward ideals -- equality, unity, self-ownership -- to which Time-Piece readers might aspire.

During the Reconstruction period the African American community that took up residence at Old Camp began its collective freedom journey. Epsibeth (originally Hepzibah), the first of four Baptist churches to be established in Aldrich, was started in 1873 by former slaves. Like other Black churches that sprang up in the 1870s, it enabled newly emancipated people to worship as they pleased. (By turn of the century Epsibeth boasted 165 members.) Men and women could now raise children without fear of family separations. Formerly enslaved men could count on regular wages for their labor in the mines. Because coal mining was to some extent seasonal, they could continue to farm during the summer months, many on land they owned. (Time-Piece repeatedly urged smart farming practices. Don't grow cotton! Don't sharecrop! Purchase your own land!)

The Old Camp community in Aldrich quickly developed a reputation for high-quality education under the leadership of Selma-educated Baptist preacherteachers. One in particular, the Rev. D. L. Prentice (no known relation to Rev. Joseph Prentice), was lauded for "very effective work in the school room." His strenuous "pedagogic labors" invigorated the whole community, wrote historian C. O. Boothe in 1895 (Cyclopedia). Such vigor persuaded the likes of Booker Lester to cast his lot with a network of educational activists in Aldrich. The Time-Piece and the Negro Grammar School, which he guided as principal, were sites of his activism.

Alabama Time-Piece is a crucial piece of an inspiring story. The pocket watch proudly brandished on the front page and masthead of this "TIMELY and TIMIEST" paper tells a small part of a great transformation, a local moment in the up-from-slavery journey of four million African Americans. People went from being owned to being owners, from being property to being persons. Persons at liberty to subscribe to a Time-Piece of their own.

#### **GETTING READY FOR THE HOLIDAYS**

The most important task you have in getting ready for Christmas, is preparing your chimney for Santa's arrival. While the best time to clean your chimney is during warmer months, you really don't want Santa arriving with his clothes "all tarnished with ashes and soot". The National Fire Prevention Association recommends you have a professional chimney sweep clean and inspect your chimney annually. We have it on good authority that "when you're with a sweep, you're in glad company" and "good luck will rub off when (they) shakes 'ands with you."

It is possible to clean your chimney yourself and there are specialized brushes available for the job. Cleaning a chimney can get messy so whether you use a professional or not, consider using drop cloths or plastic liners in the living area. Some people swear by burning specialized logs, potato peels, aluminum cans or salt as ways to clean a chimney. However, those methods tend to break up the creosote but will still leave Santa very dirty when he travels down the chimney.

If you happen to live in a newer home, chances are you don't have a chimney. Between 2005 and 2017, the number of new single-family houses built with fireplaces in the United States dropped from 818,000 to 320,000. This drop in the number of new fire places is due to the following:

- The increased costs of installation and/or maintenance.
- The rising prices of houses with fireplaces.
- The wide availability of alternative heating solutions nowadays compared to the past.
- The growth in warmer areas that's accompanied by the slowdown or steadiness of the numbers of new homes in the Northeast.





- The increased loss of heat on account of open chilmney designs.
- The presence of regulations against constructing houses with a fireplace in areas or states of high fire risks.
- · Potential house insurance liability.
- Advancements in heating/cooking solutions led to a significant reduction in the need for open fire, which deemed fireplaces a luxury instead of a necessity.

Even If you have a fireplace, you may not have a chimney since not all fireplaces require a chimney these days.

Do not worry if you don't have a chimney. Santa's magic key works on new and old homes and he doesn't mind coming in the front or back door. You will have more time to bake cookies for him.


