Christmas Wreaths for Montevallo's Veterans

Wreath laying ceremonies will be held all over the United States at 12:00 noon on Saturday December 17, 2022. A local ceremony is scheduled for Montevallo City Cemetery at that time and will be open to the public.

When I heard that graves of veterans buried in the Montevallo City Cemetery would be marked and remembered with live Christmas wreaths during the holidays this year, I knew that I wanted to help honor the service and sacrifices of four of my relatives who served in the armed forces of the United States. My father, my maternal grandfather, and two of my maternal uncles (my mother's brothers) are buried in two adjacent plots in the Montevallo City Cemetery.

Thanks to the inspiration and efforts of Marilynn Winslett Donoho and Judy Lien Duda, an affiliation was arranged with the "Wreaths Across America" organization that brought in the Montevallo Historical Society as sponsor for this local component of what has become an annual event at military and civilian cemeteries nationwide.

My father, Clayton O. Nordan (born in 1914) was a Captain in the U.S. Army and served in the European Theatre in World War II. He commanded "B" Battery of the 277th Field Artillery battalion,


which was a part of General George Patton's 3rd Army that charged across France, Belgium, and Luxembourg following the D-Day Invasion in June of 1944. They fought in the "Battle of the Bulge" and ultimately crossed the Rhine River in Germany in the spring of 1945 which soon led to the surrender of the retreating Nazi army and the end of the war.

Capt. Nordan's battery consisted of two 240 mm Howitzer cannons (the largest in the U.S. arsenal) which they moved across Europe using heavy trucks and set them in numerous firing positions throughout the campaign. His claim to fame during the "Bulge" was firing the first artillery shell in the famous "Relief of Bastogne", the Belgian city where U.S. forces were encircled and pinned down by German forces before Patton rescued them.

My grandfather, W.M. "Mack" Wyatt (born in 1892) was a corporal in the U.S. Army in World War I. He was conscripted in August of 1918 and reported to basic training in Augusta, GA that same month. He spent his entire enlistment stateside and was released and honorably discharged that December when the war ended. He came to Montevallo from Clanton in 1935 when he bought the Montevallo Times. He also served as Montevallo may-

or from 1948 until his death in 1966.

My uncle, 1st Lt. James Alexander "Jimmie" Wyatt (born in 1922), was a fighter pilot in the U.S. Army Air Corps in World War II. He flew P-47 fighters out of England usually in escort of bomber groups on missions to destroy targets both in Germany and German occupied territory. In a dogfight in the Hamburg, Germany area, he was shot up by a Luftwaffe fighter but was able to keep his ship airborne and limp back at low altitude to his base across the English Channel. Lt. Wyatt was awarded the Purple Heart and went to his grave with machine gun bullet splinters in his leg.



I have no doubt that similar stories of valor and courage along with impressive accomplishents during their military service could be told about many of the 100+ veterans that we know are buried in the Montevallo City Cemetery. 



Untold Storie OF BLACK MONTEVALL

Keeping Times with the Times: The Aldrich Time-Piece

From 1895 to 1902, in the coal mining town of Aldrich, a Blackedited newspaper was published weekly. The Aldrich Time-Piece is an untold story of African American initiative and and self-expression in the post-Reconstruction period. Remarkably, it put Black experience at the center of an enterprise that boldly proclaimed its desire to be read "in every home in Alabama."



The *Time-Piece* was published every Friday by the Aldrich Publishing Co. A number of issues from 1898 have survived on microfilm. The paper, which declared itself to be the official organ of the Shelby county GOP, was probably subsidized by William F. Aldrich, the coal-mine operator who gave his name to the town and who was three times elected to Congress from the 4th District. The Time-Piece campaigned hard for Aldrich, a Republican, during election season. As the editor wrote, "The negro must vote with the party which set him free, when other parties were beating the very life out of him" (14 Oct).

A key figure in the Time-Piece story is its editor, B. L. "Booker" Lester. An energetic young man with a passion for education, Lester served also as principal of Aldrich Grammar School and may have been responsible for ambitious progressive curriculum. The Bibb County Baptist Association hailed him as one of several fine teachers "struggling to bring our people up, along this educational line" and a "hero in our Sunday School work."

To get a taste of the style of Lester's editorship, in particular his humorous approach to the theme of Black betterment. consider this excerpt from "A Few Don'ts for Farmers."

This wry advice to local farmers illustrates his emphasis economic self-sufficiency and education. "Don't fail to patronise colored merchants," he urges; "Don't fail to educate your children." And, finally, "don't fail to subscribe to the Time-Piece"!

A FEW DON'TS FOR FARMERS. Don't mortgage Don't rent, but buy. Don't raise too much cotton. Don't sell corn at 50 cents and buy Don't overcrop your force. Don't fail to read The Time-Piece. Don't fail to patronize colored mer-Don't fail to educate your children. Don't buy too much guano for the Don't trade on credit. Don't raise cotton instead of corn, peas, potatoes, fat gardens, fat hogs, fat cows and calves and other neces-sary things. Don't fail to send your subscription (by express, registered letter or stamps) to The Aldrich Time Piece if want a good paper,

Every surviving issue of Time-Piece highlights Black business enterprises in the area. A large ad that ran every week promotes a "Negro Store" in nearby Randolph. The language pleads its own cause of racial independence: "We are not in opposition to white's stores," it begins reassuringly, "but we Negroes want to DO SOMETHING, accomplish SOMETHING and TURN UP SOMETHING" by selling our own goods to our own people. A section entitled Local and Personal (May 5) leads with an account of the general merchandise store recently opened in Aldrich by Rev. Prentice & Son. (Prentice is the same esteemed religious leader for whom the all-Negro Montevallo HS was later named.) The store offered Black mining families an alternative to the more expensive company store, and it promised that patrons would be treated with respect. "Call and see them. They will treat you right."

To promote his own enterprise, Lester uses teasing. whimsical language that amuses while presenting a non-threatening face to his white supporters. He urges his readers to act as subscription agents. The Time-Piece should be read "in every home If you can't work for the paper, will in Alabama." He indulges in a little lively word play: "If you want to keep Times with the Times, the Time-Piece is the TIMELY and TIMIEST TIMES. Please, dear reader, send Timely orders, with Timely

It is a sign of the vitality of the Black coal mining community at Aldrich that for nearly seven years it nourished the educational and economic activism of Booker Lester and the *Time-Piece*. The story continues next month.

The University of Montevallo celebrated 126 years on Thursday, Oct. 13, with a convocation and several faculty, staff and alumni were honored with awards for their exemplary work and service on the afternoon of Founders' Day.

The theme of this year's Founders' Day was A Montevallo Moment. President John W. Stewart III said at the convocation that the theme represents how the Montevallo family is truly held together by their experiences and moments at UM, both large and small.


"A Montevallo Moment may come from personal success or recognition, or it may be the smallest act of kindness that leads to lifelong friendships on our campus," he said.

One of the awards went to Dr. Jermaine Mitchell, an assistant professor of exercise science who died on Feb. 20 at the age of 41, was posthumously awarded the renamed Jermaine Mitchell Faculty Service Award for his dedication to community service and his impact on the University community. His wife, Dr. Qshequilla Mitchell, accepted it on his behalf.

"He was a great friend, an incredible person, who led the way in service for the department," said Dr. Claire Edwards, president of the Faculty Senate. "He showed heart and compassion for people and their wellness. He strived for inclusion, built relationships and was devoted to the disadvantaged and misfortunate."



AMERICAN VILLAGE CELEBRATES VETERANS DAY

The first celebration using the term Veterans Day occurred in Birmingham, Alabama, in 1947. Raymond Weeks, a World War II veteran, organized "National Veterans Day," which included a parade and other festivities, to honor all veterans. The event was held on November 11, then designated Armistice Day. Later, President Eisenhower signed a bill from Congress that would change Armistice Day to Veterans Day. Local parades and ceremonies are now annual events celebrated nationwide on November 11.

Veterans Day at the American Village is centered around honoring veterans, and recognizing their service to our Nation. On Washington's Birthday 2014, the National Veterans Shrine and Register of Honor was dedicated. This beautiful building is patterned after historic Carpenters Hall of Philadelphia, meeting place of the first Continental Congress.

A historic marker at Carpenters Hall says, "Within these walls, Henry, Hancock and Adams inspired the delegates of the Colonies with nerve and sinew for the toils of war." The National Veterans Shrine was built to inspire citizens with the stories of our veterans who have borne the burden of the toils of war and keeping the peace. In the Foyer of the Veterans Shrine you will see prominently displayed two sentences from the July 4, 1776 Declaration of Independence. The first is the more familiar:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, and that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness..."

The second sentence you will see is a solemn resolve: "For the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.'

This was and is the high price of liberty: the necessity to pledge one's life, fortune, and sacred honor.

To date, over 4,000 men and women who served in the United States Armed Forces have been honored by inclusion in the Veterans Register of Honor. To find out how to include a veteran in your family, visit www.veteransregisterofhonor.com. This project of the American Village is without charge.







GOLD MEDAL OLYMPIAN VISITS MONTEVALLO

As a finale for the University of Montevallo Founders' Day celebration on Oct. 13, Olympian Vonetta Flowers gave a speech at the Dr. Fallin Lecture Series.

Flowers won a gold medal in 2002 for women's bobsledding with her partner Jill Bakken. She became the first Black athlete to win gold in the Winter Olympics.

From Bessemer, Flowers started out as a sprinter and long jumper at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. She attempted many tryouts for USA's Olympic track team but emerged unsuccessful.

Flowers described that her husband joked she could join the bobsledding team. They saw a flyer to join as they left her final tryout for the USA track team.

"What started out as a joke turned out to be my road to gold," said Flowers.

She refused to give up and found her opportunity to be part of the first USA Olympic women's bobsledding team. After putting on 20 pounds of muscle and undergoing intensive training, Flowers made history at the 2002 Winter Olympics.

UM held the event at the Center of the Arts Discover Shelby Theatre. Dr. Wilson Fallin, Jr. attended and said the event was a tremendous experience. He is appreciative of the lecture series named in his honor.
